

BLIND FIELD SERVICES

BFS is part of the Specialized Services Division of the California Department of Rehabilitation (DOR). BFS staff works with blind or visually impaired persons to find employment and educational opportunities.

ELIGIBILITY

An individual may be eligible for services if the following conditions are met:

1. Has a visual impairment that makes it significantly difficult to be independent and to get or keep a job.
2. Vocational rehabilitation services are needed to get or keep a job.

Blind Field Services (BFS) helps persons who are blind or visually impaired become independent and employable. BFS helps blind or visually impaired students and young adults prepare for and pursue education and job opportunities.

TYPES OF TRANSITION SERVICES

- Coordination of services from high-school to higher education or job training
- Information & referral services for educational, training and employment programs
- Job readiness workshops
- Summer & seasonal work experience and internship opportunities
- Assistive Technology when appropriate
- Skills for living independently
- Orientation and mobility
- Communication skills
- Assistance with college planning
- Job placement assistance
